When marriage counsellors describe the challenge of enjoying being married faithfully for decades, they often discuss "the big three." The three key elements necessary for a marriage to survive until death do us part are: Commitment, Communication, and Conflict resolution.

The focus of this workshop will be on **commitment**. After all, if a couple lose their commitment to live together, the other marriage elements really don't matter. *Commitment is the glue that holds a couple together through the changes that come into their relationship during decades of married life.*

God wants our earthly (horizontal) relationships to be built upon spiritual (vertical) relationships. During the workshop, commitment will be examined from the perspective of God's **faithfulness** in keeping his covenants through the centuries. Conversation and case studies will centre on loving loyalty, loving submission, and the contrast between lust and love (which is the difference between the world of the flesh and the world of the Spirit).
